



The Dairy and Heritage Museum, once owned by Andy & Lottie Van Kasteren, includes a collection gathered over 40 years of Ontario's dairy heritage. The museum was recently purchased by Gay Lea Foods Co-Operative Ltd. The Dairy and Heritage Museum now referred to as the Gay Lea Dairy Heritage Museum remains in Malahide Township.

The museum could have been re-located but a decision was made not to look any further for a new location but rather to negotiate and purchase the property that the museum was already situated on. Gay Lea Foods decided to purchase the heritage museum to support Ontario's dairy history, as well as, to provide a link between Ontario's dairy farmers and consumers.

Although the Museum has new owners, the Van Kasteren's are acting as advisors to assist with the transition of the museum and will maintain the grounds and perform other maintenance duties.

The Gay Lea Dairy Heritage Museum has something for the entire family from agricultural history to antique displays and interactive activities for all ages.
