Large Items: We continue to have disposal of large household furniture, appliances and mattresses at Antonissen Trucking, 48828 Sparta Line, every Wednesday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and every Saturday from 7:00 a.m. until noon; and also at Putnam's Disposal, 10609 Imperial Road, during regular business hours. Recycling/ Blue Boxes



Blue Box pick-up is every other week. If you are unsure which week is a Blue Box pick-up week, call the Township Office at 773-5344. We enclosed a Blue Box calendar for your convenience with your interim tax notice. Have your garbage and your Blue Box out to the curb by 6:30 a.m. The following items can be placed in your Blue Box:

Glass Bottles & Jars - rinsed & labels and lids removed.

Metal Food & Beverage Cans - rinsed & labels removed.

Rigid Plastic Containers with a 1 or 2 recycling symbol on the bottom.

NOTE: Clam Shell containers, plastic

egg containers or take-out containers are no longer accepted in your Blue Box even though they have a #1 or a #2 on the bottom.

Newspaper - Bundled & tied or placed in a brown paper bag.

Corrugated Cardboard - Flattened & bundled. No larger than 18"x18"x18".

Boxboard - Includes cereal, shoe, tissue boxes, etc. Flatten & bundle or fill one boxboard box with the rest. No Juice or Milk Cartons. No Pizza Boxes.

Mixed Papers - Includes office paper, cash receipts and rolls, junk mail, magazines, telephone books, hard or soft cover books. Bundled & tied or placed in a brown paper bag.

NOTE: If an item isn't listed above, don't put it in your Blue Box; put it in your garbage - with the exception of Household Hazardous Waste.

Additional Blue Boxes can be purchased at the Township Office for \$10.00.

A Household Hazardous Waste Depot & an Electronics Depot has been scheduled for September 17, 2011. Contact the Township Office for a list of the Household Hazardous Waste that you can bring to the Township Depot, as well as, used or broken electronic equipment, including: computers (whole or part) monitors, keyboards, hard drives, computer servers, printers, cell phones, VCR players, DVD players, etc.

Dog Licensing Process



When you purchased your 2010 Dog Tag/License(s) you had the option of receiving your 2011 Dog Tag directly in the mail. If you signed up for this option, your 2011 Dog Tag was mailed in early January.

If you did not sign up for this option, Dog Tags are now available at the Township Office for purchase. **IMPORTANT** to note that the early purchase of your dog tag will save you \$33.00 per tag!

Dog Tag Fees:

1 Dog - \$51.00 or **\$18.00 if paid before March 31st.**

2 Dogs - \$107.00 or **\$41.00 if paid before March 31st.**

3 Dogs - \$183.00 or **\$84.00 if paid before March 31st.**

Kennel Licence (Must be registered) - \$66.00 or **\$33.00 if paid before March 31st.**

Failure to register your dog for a license or failure to renew your dog license will result in a fine of \$130.00.

Spring Maintenance of Drains

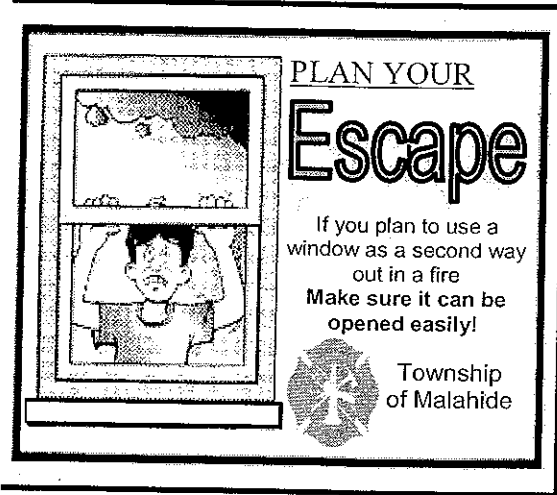

Emergency Planning

A major emergency – like a blackout or severe storm – can happen anytime, anywhere. You need to take action by knowing the risks, making a plan and preparing an emergency kit. Ensure you and your

family can take care of yourselves for at least the first 72 hours of an emergency, while first responders help those in urgent need.

Know the risks – Although the consequences of disasters can be similar, (ie: you might lose power, drinking water might not be available, etc.), knowing the risks specific to your community and your region can help you better prepare.

Make a plan – Every Canadian household needs an emergency plan. It will help you and your family know what to do if disaster strikes. Practice what to do in different emergency situations, and decide where your family would reunite if an emergency strikes.

Prepare a kit – An emergency kit should contain food, water, radio, flashlight, batteries, and other essentials to help ensure you and your family are ready to cope on your own for at least 72 hours of an emergency.

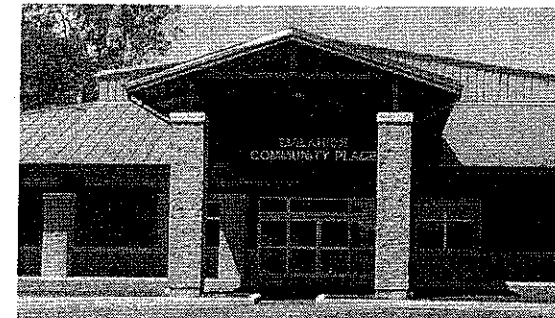
Waterline Emergencies – Please call the Water/Wastewater Manager at 519-495-6375 or the Ontario Clean Water Agency at 519-435-6456.
